It is with pride and a great sense of accomplishment that I am writing this report. Your PD Committee has delivered a year of well-attended events. Through the member survey and session feedback, we were able to respond to members' PD needs and wants. Thank you, colleagues for your dedication to lifelong learning and therefore enhance students' learning.

The PD Committee offered a total of 32 sessions, almost 2000 learning opportunities for teachers in the program areas identified in the member survey conducted in April 2023 and the ongoing session feedback. The Eventbrite registration system with a deposit policy has significantly improved the attendance.

The table here summarized the sessions with description.

Program Area	Summary
Mentorship Program	The Mentorship Program supports new teachers with planning, assessment, sharing of resources, and many other areas that arise during a new teacher's journey. Seventy pairs of mentors and protégés signed up for this program and each pair had access to three substitute teacher days. The release time was dedicated to: Helping with planning units of study, discussion on assessment tools Building IPP's Visiting/observing other classrooms in teachers' schools Examining philosophies of teaching and learning Accessing and developing resources
	Visiting professional libraries or learning sites, etc.

	Throughout the year there were three after school sessions that brought the participants together to collaborate and share their insights. We concluded this year's program with a wellness workshop facilitated by the ATA PD Staff Officer, Dr. Stacey Hannay, sending off our teachers to the end of the year with a renewed energy and brighter outlook for their career.
Land-based Learning	The Committee offered this land-based learning session • A day trip to Blackfoot Crossing Historical Park
Teacher Collaboration	This year 80 teachers with a minimum of three years of teaching experiences were accepted for this program and each partner had access to a full day of release time. The participants used the time to on the learning areas they deem would enhance their student' learning. This program began in the fall with an introduction meeting and wrapped up in May with presentations shared by the participants on what they have achieved through the collaboration.
Mental Health	The Committee delivered three sessions addressing student mental health. • Looking Forward – Preventing Suicide in Youth (two sessions) • Rethinking Challenging Kids
Teacher Wellness	Teacher wellness continued to be the high-demanding program. We were pleased that we were able to offer session in different venues to further professional conversations and recharge teachers' power bank. • You Are the Light! An evening at Zoo Lights • Spark after Dark • Theatre Calgary – Made in Italy • Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra - IndigiDivas • HEARTCare – Walk and Talk at Ann & Sandy Cross Conservation Area (two sessions) • Yoga & Mindfulness • Story Book Theatre - One Christmas Carol • Let's Play – cooperative wellness at Activate • Breaking Bread with Chef Martin series (four sessions)
Diversity and Inclusion	 Inclusion in a Film – Peace by Chocolate Supporting One, Supporting All – an evening with Dr Shelley Moore Strategies that work for students with ADHD (two sessions) Discovering Empathy with Gayathri Shukla (two sessions) Active Learning for teachers working in Special Ed Setting
Women in Leadership	We co-sponsored two WIL sessions of Growing Leaders through Networking
