10 WAYS TO ENGAGE IN AN ANTIRACIST HOLIDAY SEASON

- 2. Attend and **support local Indigenous markets**. Keep an eye on <u>Authentically Indigenous</u> and <u>4 Winds YYC</u> for more information throughout the year!
- 3. Gift your family and friends with **books related to anti**racism, or books written by BIPOC authors! Might we suggest looking back on previous *Monthly Book Reccs* from our latest ATN Newsletters?
- 4. Take the time to **learn about the various holidays** celebrated by communities around the world. <u>The Center</u> <u>for Racial Justice in Education</u> provides a diverse starting point.
- 5. **Support local BIPOC restaurants** for your holiday meals and gatherings!
- 6.Change up your Holiday Playlist to feature BIPOC artists.
