## ACTIONS OUTSIDE OF DAYS OF AWARENESS

From the desks of the Antiracist Teachers Network:

It has now been over five years since the end of the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and the release of the final report with the 231 individual calls to justice. (If you have yet to read through this report we highly encourage it along with the Supplementary Report: A Legal Analysis of Genocide)

Yet, we have not seen any definitive action to meet these individual calls to justice alongside ongoing violence against Indigenous communities across Turtle Island.

Since solidarity and support of Indigenous causes transcends months and days of awareness we wanted to take this issue to highlight Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Cirls and Two-Spirit individuals (#MMIWG2S+). We hope this issue helps to raise awareness, inspire action and generate conversations within your classrooms and school communities.
