From the desks of the Antiracist Teachers Network:

As leaders, we have a duty to serve all students, staff, and families. Despite good intentions, it is vital for leaders to constantly be reflecting and learning how leadership practices can be responsive and inclusive to the staff, students and families we serve.

So what does it mean to be a culturally responsive leader? How does one work towards being an anti-oppressive leader? While there is no concrete answer, here are some reflective questions to guide your understanding:

- 1) What can I do to learn more about marginalized communities? How about the communities I work with?
- 2) How do I use my power, positionality, and resources to elevate marginalized voices? Whether it be in meetings, PD, or in decision making processes?
- 3) How do I show up for the community?
- 4) How do I respond as a leader when I receive critical feedback?
- 5) How do I use my position and leadership to create learning opportunities with those I work with?

We hope the resources shared in this month's newsletter will help create moments of growth and reflection in order for your leadership practices to align with your intentions and understandings of anti-racism.
