CLIMATE CHANGE TO CLIMATE JUSTICE

From the desks of the Antiracist Teachers Network:

Look, we won't lie to you, many of us in the ATN grew up witnessing the impact of climate change in real-time alongside our learning, and the latest <u>Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) AR6 Synthesis Report on Climate Change</u> further confirms what we know (and we recommend checking out <u>the "Figures" section</u> for those who love a good infographic or twenty-seven).

Climate Change is real and has a disproportionate effect on racialized populations.

The IPCC and the ATN are not the first groups to state this idea. In fact, many others researched, explored and discussed this reality at length before this newsletter was published. However, the voices of racialized populations are often ignored in the conversations around climate change and the need for climate justice.

Following the lead of many of Calgary and Canada's youth climate activists, we hope our latest issue helps to center these voices and shift our conversation on climate change to one that paves the way for climate and racial justice.
