Stories of Decolonization is a multi-film interview-based documentary project created by Elizabeth Carlson-Manathara, Teddy Zegeye-Gebrehiwot, and Gladys Rowe. The series shares personal stories in order to explore accessible understandings of colonialism and its continued impacts on those living on the lands now called Canada. The films are meant to offer a learning space for everyone – and will be a good resource for those who work with or look to engage with Indigenous peoples.

Film 2: Stories of Decolonization: (De)Colonial Relations

This is the second film in the series, is the project's newest release. In this bilingual film (French and English, with subtitles), personal stories are woven into key insights about ongoing processes and structures of colonialism in Canada and the relationships and social locations carried by diverse peoples living on lands occupied by the Canadian state. With sensitivity to the intersectional oppressions experienced by diverse groups and the challenges these present, the film illuminates pathways forward toward solidarity, deeper relationality, and decolonization.
