

WAYS TO DISCUSS: ANTI-SEMITISM

- Here to Tell: Faces of Holocaust Survivors is a project developed by the Calgary Jewish Federation to share the stories of local survivors of the Holocaust. You can see this exhibit in person at the Central Library from January 6th 31st, 2023 or explore it online through their Instagram Meheretotell fhs
- Fight Antisemitism (or FightIt) provides <u>a quick guide on</u> what Antisemitism is and how to spot it online
- The Holocaust Centre North provides the informative article The Problem With 'The Boy In The Striped Pyjamas' detailing why this resource needs to be clearly labelled as fiction and suggests alternative resources for teaching on the Holocaust and Anti-Semitism specifically.
- <u>Some Were Neighbours</u> is an online interactive exhibit from the <u>United States Holocaust Memorial Museum</u> which provides survivors' stories and first hand accounts. We recommend this resource for grades 9-12.

WAYS TO DISCUSS: ISLAMOPHOBIA

- The National Film Board of Canada has developed a playlist of films to explore Islamophobia with #WeRememberJan29




