DENOUCING ANTI-SEMITISM EVERYDAY!

From the desks of the Antiracist Teachers Network:

Tackling topics of targeted hate towards marginalized groups is not something the AntiRacist Teacher's Network has ever shied away from. With Canadian Jewish Heritage Month starting alongside Asian Heritage Month, we at the ATN decided to pivot and bring awareness to this month by highlighting starting with some key information.

As noted in B'nai Brith Canada's League for Human Rights Annual Audit of Antisemitic Incidents for 2022, almost 8 antisemitic incidents occurred every day in Canada, an increase of one compared to last year. 2021 and 2022 mark some of the highest rates of antisemitic incidents in the organization's auditing history. There was some hope in this final report however as Antisemitic incidents are down as a whole. Alberta officially accepted the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA)'s definition of the Holocaust in official legislation which reads:

"Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities."

Antisemitic hate, however, still finds a home in Alberta despite our efforts as educators. We must continue to call it out and denounce it in our classrooms and school communities as denialism and targeted hate continues to be recorded.
